Wairoa District Council overview

- Role of local government
 - Established in statute
 - Authority to make decisions in the best long-term interests of the community
 - Consists of city, district and regional councils
 - Hawke's Bay is one of 11 regional councils
 - Wairoa is one of 54 district councils
 - There are six unitary authorities

POA DISTRICT COUNT

- Functions, responsibilities and activities
 - The purpose of the Wairoa District Council is to enable democratic local decision-making to promote the social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being of the Wairoa District in the present and for the future.



Wairoa District Council overview

- MAIROA DISTRICT COUNCIL
- In meeting its purpose the Wairoa District Council has a variety of roles:
 - Facilitating solutions to local needs
 - Advocacy on behalf of the local community with central government, other local authorities and other agencies
 - Development of local resources



Wairoa District Council overview

- Management of local infrastructure including network infrastructure (e.g. roads, sewage disposal, water, stormwater) and community infrastructure (libraries, parks and recreational facilities)
- Environmental management
- Planning for the future needs of the local district

Elections overview: General information

- Wairoa District Council has 5,461 electors (at 30 April 2016)
- Elections held by postal vote
- Election day Saturday 8 October
- Two electoral systems used FPP and STV
- Order of candidate names alphabetical



Elections overview: Key election dates

Date	Activity
Friday 15 July	Nominations open
Friday 12 August	Nominations close
Friday 13 September to Wednesday 21 September	Delivery of voting documents
Saturday 8 October	Election day, preliminary results after noon
Thursday 13 October	Declaration of results
Saturday 15 October	Public notice of declaration
Sunday 16 October	Elected members come into office

Elections overview: Elections required

- Mayor (1) elected at large
- Councillors (6) elected at large
- Hawke's Bay Regional Council (1) Wairoa Constituency
- Hawke's Bay Health Board Members (7) elected at large





Elections overview: Elections required

- Māori representation poll
 - Held at same time as triennial Council election
 - Poll to determine whether Wairoa District is to be divided into one or more Māori wards
 - Outcome of poll binding for two triennial elections (2019, 2022)





Elections overview: Electoral systems

Two electoral systems used:

- First Past the Post (FPP)
 - Vote by ticking candidates names (for number of vacancies)
 - Candidates with highest number votes wins
 - Used for Wairoa District Council and Hawke's Bay Regional Council
- Single Transferable Voting (STV)
 - · Form of preferential voting
 - Vote by ranking candidate names in order of preference
 - · Used for Hawke's Bay District Health Board



Elections overview: Electoral rolls

- Wairoa District Council compiles two electoral rolls:
 - Resident electoral roll
 - New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
 - Aged 18 or over
 - · Resided continuously in New Zealand for one year or more
 - · Resided at an address for one month or more
 - Total 5,461 resident electors (30 April 2016)




Elections overview: Electoral rolls

- Ratepayer electoral roll
 - · For non-resident electors
 - · Updated every three years
 - By application, not automatic
 - Approximately 100 rate payer electors (October 2013)



Elections overview: Candidate qualifications

- Candidates for district council:
 - New Zealand citizen
 - Over the age of 18
 - Enrolled on the parliamentary electoral roll (anywhere)
 - · Cannot stand for the district council and the regional council



 Any employee of Wairoa District Council who is elected must resign as employee before taking up position

- Nominations open Friday 15 July 2016
- Nomination papers will be available from:
 - Wairoa District Council's office's, Coronation Square, Queen Street, Wairoa
 - by phoning (06) 838 7309
 - by accessing www.wairoadc.govt.nz





Elections overview: Nomination process

- Cannot nominate yourself
- Nominated by two electors from district
- Each nomination requires:
 - \$200 (including GST) deposit (most are refunded)
 - 150 word candidate profile statement
 - Recent passport-size colour photo



Elections overview: Nomination process

- Candidates are able to have affiliation or can be independent
- Unacceptable affiliations
 - Might cause offence
 - · Likely to cause confuse or mislead electors
 - Is an election slogan
- Nomination close noon, Friday 12 August
- Also required to include:
 - Statement on principal place of residence
 - · Statement on all positions standing for



Elections overview: Campaigning

- Campaigning can occur anytime, including election day
- Election signs permitted on private property (with owners consent) from Monday 8 August 2016
- Election signs must be removed by midnight Friday 7
 October 2016
- Election signs not permitted on council-owned property
- Election signs must show details of authorising person

Elections overview: Campaigning

- Candidates or their agents must not collect voting documents from electors
- Be mindful of election offences



Elections overview: Candidate expenditure

 All positions have candidate election expenditure limits based on population of area

Up to 4999	\$3500	
5000-9999	\$7000	
10,000-19,999	\$14,000	
20,000-39,999	\$20,000	
40,000-59,000	\$30,000	
60,000-79,999	\$40,000	
80,000-99,999	\$50,000

150,000-249,999	\$60,000	
250,000-999,999	\$70,000	
1,000,000 or more	\$100,000	
*plus 50c per elector		
Expenditure limits are inclusive of GST		

Elections overview: Candidate expenditure

Constituency	Population	\$ Limit
Wairoa District (6)	8,100 (est.)	\$7,000

- Expenditure to be GST inclusive
- Electoral expenses and electoral donation form must be completed
- Forms to be returned by Friday 9 December (enforced)
- Forms available for public inspection:
 - · Care to ensure accurate (declaration)

Elections overview: Scrutineers

- Candidates may appoint scrutineers
- Scrutineers can observe:
 - Roll scrutiny process (during voting period)
 - · Counting of votes (after close of voting)
- Cannot observe early processing (during voting period)
- Processing of votes undertaken in Auckland
- Must be aged over 18 years
- Scrutineer appointment before noon Friday 7 October

Elections overview: Results

- Voting closes at noon Saturday 8 October
- Progress results (98% votes counted, exclude votes lodged at district council office on election morning)
- All candidates emailed, media advised
- Preliminary results (100% votes counted) before midnight
- All results available on <u>www.wairoadc.govt.nz</u>
- Final results available Thursday 13 October, 2016
- Declaration of results in newspapers Saturday 15 October, 2016
- Elected members take office day after public notice
