What is a menacing dog? (under section 33, Dog Control Act 1996)

Dogs can be classed as menacing from their breed or are reported to be posing a threat to people, stock and wildlife. There are also five types of dogs automatically classed as menacing - the Brazilian Fila, Dogo Argentino, Japanese Tosa, Perro de Presa Canario and Pit Bulls.

A menacing dog must be on a lead and muzzled at all times when in public places to ensure the risk to the public is minimised.

What is a dangerous dog? (under section 31, Dog Control Act 1996)

Dangerous dogs are those classed as high risk, usually after an attack or aggressive behaviour that is deemed to be a serious threat to the community. Unlike menacing dogs, there are no specific breeds deemed dangerous. Once a dog is classed as dangerous it must be kept in a property that is securely fenced and allows safe access to at least
