### WAIROA COUNCIL KEEPS AVERAGE RATES LOW

Wairoa District Council rates have been recorded as the sixth lowest average rates in the country.

Wairoa District Council chief executive Steven May said the Taxpayers' Union 2019 ratepayers' report places the average Wairoa rates at \$1880, the sixth lowest of the 66 Councils that were analysed.

### OF THE 23 RURAL COUNCIL'S THE WAIROA DISTRICT COUNCIL AVERAGE RATES ARE THE FOURTH LOWEST.

Mr May said the Taxpayers' Union recorded the Mackenzie district with the lowest average rates at \$1796 followed by Grey District \$1846 and Opotiki just four dollars less than Wairoa at \$1796.

The Central Hawke's Bay District Council average rates were recorded at \$2618.

Mr May said it is pleasing to see where Wairoa's average rates sit nationally.

"It has always been Council's intention to keep rates as affordable as possible while still stimulating economic development, employment and population growth.

All information in the report, which was based on the 2017/18 period, was compiled from official information requests and the most recent annual reports published by each council.

Mr May said the Taxpayers' Union uses the same formula and methodology for all New Zealand Councils, so it is very much an apples with apples comparison, with consistent data and information used to compare all Council activities.

The Taxpayers' Union is an independent organisation which holds councils to account by championing value for money from every tax dollar as well as advocating for lower taxes, less waste and more transparency.

Mr May added the report did contain some inaccuracies around staff numbers and salary figures and these discrepancies were being sorted with the Taxpayers' Union.
