VOTER TURNOUT

Voting in local body, Central Government and other organisations is a democratic right that enables people to have their say and influence the way they would like things to happen.

While I acknowledge the people who did vote in the Wairoa District Council election it is a shame that our final voter return was down.

The 2019 election saw 51.43% of eligible voters vote which is a significant reduction when compared to the voter turnout in 2016 of 63% and 62% in 2013.

This drop is in line with a nationwide voter decline and perhaps this voting drop off indicates we need to look at other ways of engaging voters.

It is important that people participate in this process and have their say and I look forward to increased voting numbers next time around.

KITCHENER STREET PIPING UNDERWAY

The Kitchener Street stormwater upgrade is underway.

This open drain has been a safety issue and eyesore for decades and I am proud of the work and progress made by our Council and our staff to enable us to finally start addressing this major issue.

Piping this drain has been a hot topic within the community for many years and residents will be as pleased as I am that we are finally making a start.

This work is part of Council's plan to future-proof the town's stormwater network and a major step in the right direction.

Council had already made a commitment to start piping the open drain and then we were fortunate to attract additional funding for the project under the NZTA road safety funding criteria.

The work is expected to take up until around December 20, weather permitting, and will involve a road closure on Kitchener Street.

Members of the public are advised this may affect vehicle access to the hospital.
