### **TUIA 250**

Tuai 250 commemorates 250 years since the first onshore meetings between Māori - the tangata whenua of Aotearoa New Zealand and Pākehā in 1769-70.

Tuia 250 also celebrates the voyaging heritage of Pacific people that led to the settlement of Aotearoa New Zealand many generations before.

The central event is the Tuia 250 Voyage. A flotilla made up of two waka hourua from Aotearoa, three tall ships including the Endeavour

replica from Australia, and a va'a tipaerua from Tahiti, sailing New Zealand's coast to engage with communities, iwi and hapū.

The Tuia 250 Voyage launch events were held in Tūranganui-a-Kiwa (Gisborne) in October and culminate at Mahia on Sunday, December 15.

On that Sunday the Tuia-mai-tawhiti Festival will be held at Pohutukawa Drive, Mahia Beach from 8am with free admission.

A Waka Festival will celebrate the arrival of the waka hourua to Mahia-mai-tawhiti.

This grassroots festival celebrates our Pacific Voyaging traditions, the Moana, as well as showcasing local community talents and businesses.

There will be an opportunity to learn about celestial navigation in the Stardome and discover the world of voyaging through the touring Voyaging Roadshow.

Activities will demonstrate the mātauranga (knowledge) of Pacific voyagers who found and settled Aotearoa many generations ago.

The activities will begin at 8am with the arrival of the waka hourua followed by a haka pōwhiri on the beach at Mahia Beach.

The waka crew will then be transported to Ruawharo for a formal haka pōwhiri.

THE PUBLIC FESTIVAL WILL BEGIN AT MAHIA BEACH FROM 10AM AND RUNS ALL DAY AND INCLUDES THE WAKA TAURUA REGATTA AT 11AM, WAKA HOURUA TOURS FROM MIDDAY, BEACH FUN AND GAMES AND ENTERTAINMENT.

For me, this a significant national occasion and it is fantastic the commemorations will conclude at Mahia. Well done to our local organisers and all those who have, and will, participate.
