WATER TREATMENT PLANT

Level Two Water Lab Confirmed

The Wairoa township water treatment plant has received final documentation confirming its continuation as a Ministry of Health (MOH) recognised Level 2 Laboratory.

The confirmation, by IANZ (International Accreditation New Zealand), means the plant has been confirmed as compliant for the next 12 months until the next annual review.

Wairoa District Council chief executive Steven May said keeping up with the new requirements was quite a challenge given the relatively short time frame given.

The water plant's on-site recognised registered Level Two laboratory provides cost savings to the district's ratepayers.

The Council laboratory also carries out water testing for rural schools, cafés, organisations, clubs and members of the public who would have found it more difficult to use an out of town lab for micro tests considering the current timelines for couriers etc.

Meanwhile, Council is awaiting the outcome of the Government's Three waters review (drinking water, storm water and waste water).

It is expected that a new regulator will be set up by Central Government within weeks.

Mr May said Council is waiting to be informed as to how this new regulator will interface with regional and local Council operations and any additional compliance processes.


