The film club features a festival of documentary, musicals, comedy, war, romance, foreign-language and rare films. It provides a chance for local people to discover films they may never have heard of and enjoy the entertainment at the Gaiety on one of the biggest screens in the country.

Screenings are held on Wednesdays at 5:30pm at the Gaiety Theatre. Tickets are \$15 which includes a drink - enjoy a beer, wine, cider, soft drink, water, tea or coffee. Doors open from 5pm.

LONG-TERM PLAN CONSULTATION

We are nearing the end of our Long-Term Plan consultation sessions with the Raupunga session held today and the last one tomorrow (Friday May 21) at Sunset Point, Mahia from 10am-2pm.

Consultation continues until the end of the month and I encourage everyone to have their say and help build our district's future together.

The Long-Term Plan describes the activities, and the community outcomes Council hopes to achieve over the next 10 years.

The 2021-2031 Long-Term Plan consultation focusses on Levels of Service and what the community expects from Council.

The Long-Term Plan Consultation Document proposes an average rate increase of 10% for the first year of the plan (2021/22) followed by three years of average increases of around 8%. The average rates increase over the 10 years of the plan is 5.6%. We know the next four years will be hard but there is light at the end of the tunnel.

The Long-Term Plan Consultation Document focusses on delivering a similar level of service to what is presently delivered as well as servicing debt and replenishing reserves. It is about looking after our community today, and in the future.

Previously we have listened to the community and kept rates affordable and as low as possible because we had reserves to achieve that. We no longer have that luxury and have to re-set our trajectory to ensure we are in a position to look after future generations.

This is the opportunity for people to tell Council where they think it should spend its money. We really do encourage you to have your say on what matters to you so you can be a part of planning for Wairoa's future. You may have ideas that we haven't thought of and we welcome your input.
