BLOWHOLE ROAD WORKS START THIS WEEK

It is great to see that this week, work will start on returning the blowhole dropout on the road to Mahia to two

The work is part of an \$8 million coastal resilience package that will see road improvements and future-proofing works along the Nuhaka to Opoutama coastal stretch and Mahia East Coast Road.

Wairoa has around 130km of coastline, and much of it is impacted by coastal erosion, which can also impact roading networks. The blowhole work will launch the three-year coastal resilience project, which will help improve resilient connectivity.

I know returning the blowhole area to two lanes has taken a long time, and we do appreciate people's patience. It has been a long journey to confirm the final designs, particularly given the instability around this site, and land acquisition has also taken time. We were also struggling to come up with the Council's share of the funding for the repair work, and it is great we can now carry out this project using external funding with no impact on rates.

PREPARING YOUR **PETS** FOR AN EMERGENCY

Having an emergency plan is recommended for all families. This plan should include your pets too! Follow the steps below to make sure your pet is safe during a disaster.

Put together an emergency kit for your pets. Your pets emergency kit will need:

Enough food and water for at least

- A lead, collar, muzzle, a carrier, and a toy (optional),
- Bedding and/or blankets

3 days

- Bowls for food and water
- Any medications and first aid supplies
- Your contact information
- Vaccination records, microchip number and registration number.

Any large animals and/or livestock should be moved into a paddock that is free from floodwaters and power lines. Ensure they have food, water, shelter and are secured.
