These proposed changes are part of a broader shake-up to simplify planning under the new Resource Management Act (RMA) reforms. The aim is to enable more efficient, less complex regional decision-making by integrating regional functions such as water, transport, and pest control into

a single, consolidated structure.

The government has clearly signalled a focus on the fundamentals of local government, doing the basics well, living within our means and being more transparent and accountable to the community.

While locally, we already try to achieve this transparency, and we simply don’t have the funds for the ‘flashy stuff’, we must continue to ensure value for every ratepayer dollar and remain accountable to those who fund and benefit from our services, ie the ratepayers and the community at large. We must be prudent in how we spend, tighten our belts where possible and demonstrate that every dollar is working for the people we serve.

While we have a lot of work in front of us, it is an exciting time. We have a new, strong, community-focused Council committed to making Wairoa the best it can be.
