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## FROM MAYOR CRAIG LITTLE Flood mitigation project

Today, the Hawke's Bay Regional Council will hold a hui in Wairoa to decide on the preferred flood mitigation proposal for North Clyde, which will form the basis of the business case being submitted to the Government by mid-March.

The decision will consider feedback and recommendations discussed at last week's Tripartite meeting, which included the Crown Manager Lawrence Yule recommending option 1C as the best way forward. Wairoa District Council supported this recommendation.

Whilst today's decision is an important step forward in the process, there is still a huge amount of mahi ahead for us all. Our ultimate goal is to make our town as safe as possible.

It is critical we continue to work closely with our impacted mana whenua/land, home and property owners regarding the land access required to deliver flood mitigation for Wairoa. This is an incredibly difficult time for our

## impacted whānau, and we appreciate the way in which you have worked with us to date. Mana whenua/land, home and property owners have always been at the front of our discussions and as this journey progresses, it is great to be providing more information and certainty so we can work with our community to get the best solution. This is a tough time, and my heart goes out to all those affected people.

I would like to acknowledge the work that Crown Manager Lawrence Yule has completed. I have confidence in the process he has been rolling out, and our Council supports Lawrence in continuing this role.

The next step in Wairoa's flood mitigation rests with the Crown, which is also undergoing a peer review of the process and options, a further important aspect of this work.

Council is now working on its Annual Plan, which is about developing a strategy for the coming year.

Our focus is to continue rebuilding our community following the recent flooding events while also developing resilience so the whānau of Wairoa can thrive. We must balance this with an affordable and responsible financial pathway while still looking ahead.

During the development of our 2024-27 Long-Term Plan, we indicated that to achieve our community outcomes, rates would increase by 15.5% in 2025/26. However, we are endeavouring to reduce this figure if we can and are again reviewing all Council activities with the intention of reducing the forecasted rate increase.

We want to hear from our community about what projects you think we should complete over the next year, and we will be asking you to join us in building a resilient future that supports renewal and revitalisation and restores our natural environment while building community resilience to weather events and natural hazards and growing our economy.

The consultation will include community meetings and a chance to make submissions. We welcome your involvement in helping guide our future as we continue to build a resilient community.
