FROM MAYOR CRAIG LITTLE **Preserving our past**

It was a pleasure to attend a celebration at the Wairoa Museum to mark the contribution local man Dennis Munro has made to preserving Wairoa's history.

Dennis, along with a fantastic, enthusiastic support team, captured a piece of our district's history through their SALUTE Wairoa Project. This local initiative used touch table technology to showcase the lives of 900 Wairoa World War I veterans who served overseas.

Launched in 2018, the project was the country's first digital World War 1 memorial with the touch table containing maps, diaries, letters from the battlefields, films and two interactive timelines - a general one and a Māori Pioneer one.

The SALUTE Wairoa team was led by Dennis, Liz Greenslade and Sue Wilson, who, along with a team of researchers, software specialists, including Andrew Hume, and volunteers, created the unique district memorial.

The touch table, similar to a giant iPad, is on permanent display at the Wairoa Museum.

Museum Trustee Pam Bull said the touch table contents draw people from all over the country who come to look up the story of their ancestors. She described the intergenerational impact of the touch table and extended a huge thank you and appreciation on behalf of the museum and the Wairoa district.

Dennis is reluctantly leaving Wairoa due to health reasons, but he is certainly leaving a lasting local legacy. Dennis has been a rural leader with the pinnacle being awarded a Nuffield New Zealand Farming Scholarship, which is a highly regarded rural leadership programme with a global focus and one of the most valued awards in New Zealand's primary sector.

I wish Dennis all the best and applaud the work he has done for Wairoa.

Local Government elections

This year is the Local Government elections, with nominations opening next Friday, July 4 and closing on August 1 at midday.

Voting documents will be delivered between September 9 and 22, with election day held on October 11.

In New Zealand, all local body elections are held by postal vote. That means you need to fill in your voting form and post it back before midday on 11 October.

You can enrol if you're 18 or older, a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident, and have lived in New Zealand for more than one year continuously at some time in your

You can enrol or update your details online at Enrol or update online Vote N7.

If you own a property in Wairoa, but live out of the district, you can enrol as a non-resident elector by registering online at Ratepayer Elector Enrolment Portal https://ratepayer.co.nz/ call 0800 36 76 56.
