I would like to give a shout-out to all the responsible dog owners out there – and I know that is most of you. Well done and thank you.

I have a pet dog and working farm dogs, and they mean the world to me.

Sadly, what we are seeing in Wairoa is the good dog owners subsidising the irresponsible dog owners, and it has to stop. It is such a shame that there are dog owners who allow their dogs to roam, and generally not be under control. It is not the dogs' fault that they have owners who do not follow the rules, but unfortunately, these dog owners are ruining it for the rest of us.

I am constantly hearing stories of dogs wandering and even jumping fences into other people's yards. We have seen the terrible harm dog attacks have on humans and animals.

The Council will continue its focus to try to prevent dog-related issues, such as attacks, barking, roaming, etc. But we need your help. Please report

any wandering dogs or dog-related issues so we can follow up as quickly as possible. The Council's 06 838 7309 phone number is staffed 24/7.

A significant amount of our Council's animal control budget is related to costs associated with irresponsible dog owners.

Because of this, we have had to purchase two new trucks purpose-designed for animal control. They feature five animal cages and a range of functions that will assist staff in doing their job and providing a quicker and more efficient response.

We are also faced with the cost of building a new dog pound to meet legislative standards and improve animal welfare for the roaming dogs that are impounded. This will be expensive, and under the legislation, it is a facility that the Council is required to provide.

To those of you who microchip and register your dogs, who keep them under control and are genuinely responsible dog owners, thank you. To those who knowingly allow their dogs

to roam, do not have them registered and do not have them under control – please change your approach to make it safer, easier and cheaper – for our whole community. Being an irresponsible dog owner will come at a cost to you.



