FROM MAYOR CRAIG LITTLE WAIROA FLOOD MITIGATION PROJECT

Significant progress is being made on the Wairoa Flood Mitigation Project.

Managed by Crown Manager Lawrence Yule, the project involves the construction of a spillway and stopbanks, to help mitigate the severity of future flooding in North Clyde.

We remain grateful to the government for the \$70 million ringfenced for Wairoa for flood mitigation work.

Progress is being made across land access negotiations, cultural assessments, and technical design work, bringing the project closer to its 2025/26 summer construction start target.

This project will enable the North Clyde properties currently categorised as provisional 2C to be released to Category 1. This will be a game-changer for North Clyde, enabling home and business owners to rebuild their lives with confidence and certainty.

I would especially like to thank those landowners whose land is directly impacted by this project and who have made the decision to allow access to their whenua. We acknowledge, respect

and thank you for your commitment to helping protect our town.

It was great to see 41 properties along the Frasertown Road recategorised from provisional Category 2C to Category 1. This followed technical assessments, which confirmed that flooding in the area came from the Awatere Stream/Paeroa Drainage Scheme, rather than the Wairoa River. This is excellent news for these property owners.

Meanwhile, the detailed design of protection measures on the south side of the river near Mitchell Road is also being finalised.

MĀHANGA WATER SUPPLY RESTRICTIONS

Māhanga Beach residents are being asked to restrict use of the non-potable Māhanga supply water over the busy summer period.

The restriction will take effect from December 1, as the water supply is already experiencing supply issues. Council will notify residents when the restriction is lifted.

The restrictions are vital to ensure the continued availability of Māhanga's water supply for essential needs, particularly in the event of a fire emergency.

The Māhanga water supply is non-potable, and as a precaution, all water from the Māhanga supply should be boiled.

The restriction is in accordance with Section 7.3 of the Water Supply Bylaw 2022, with the following outdoor Council-supplied water use activities prohibited from December 1 2025: watering of lawns and gardens, car/boat washing, filling of pools, fountains, or other water features, and any other outdoor water uses.



GET YOUR FIX – GET DESEXING

Did you know that you may be able to get your dog spayed or neutered free of charge?

Thanks to sponsorship by the Fred Lewis Foundation Charitable Trust, if you meet the conditions, the cost of de-sexing your dog could be free.

Desexing can help prevent unwanted pregnancies and reduce stress. It also helps mitigate dog behavioural issues, aggression, and wandering instincts.

Desexing, also referred to as neutering, spaying, or sterilisation, involves

the surgical removal of the animal's reproductive system to prevent breeding or having babies.

Desexing is the best way we can reduce the number of unwanted dogs and puppies. All procedures are carried out in Wairoa by a veterinarian.

Please contact the Council and ask to speak with one of our compliance team members to determine if you qualify for a free desexing voucher for your dog. In most cases, Community Service and Gold Card holders will meet the criteria.


